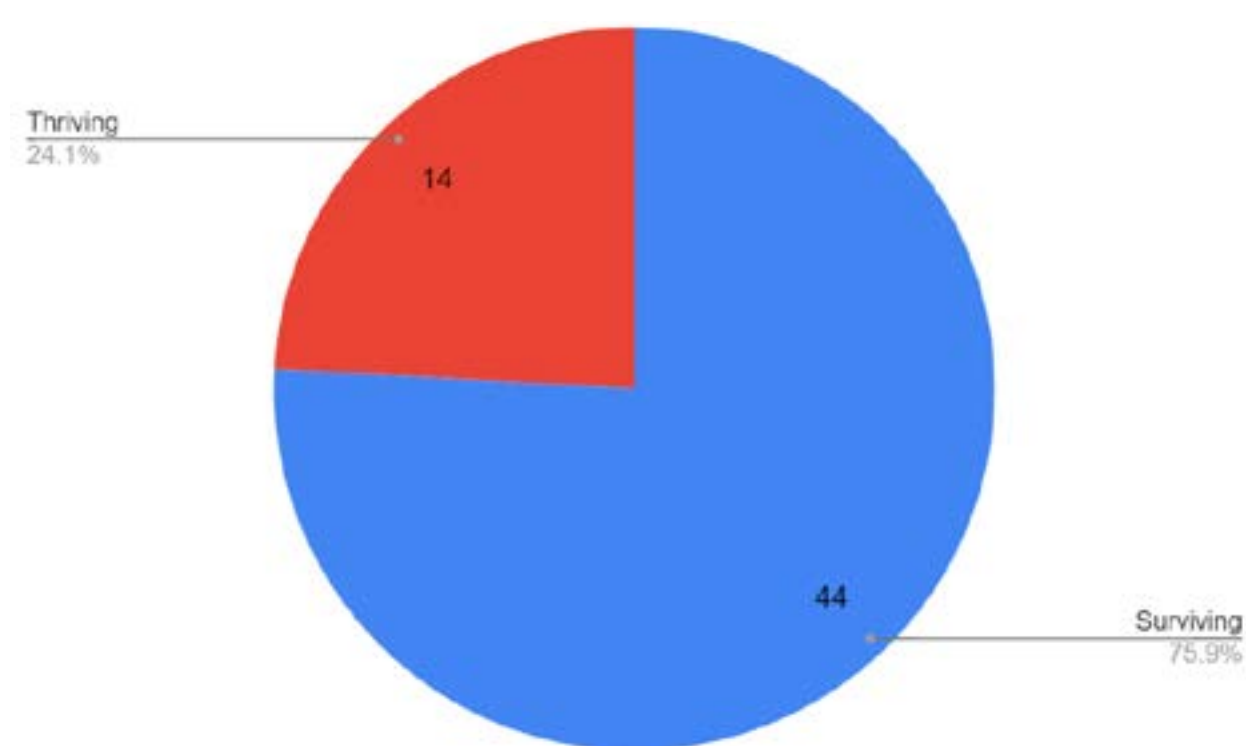

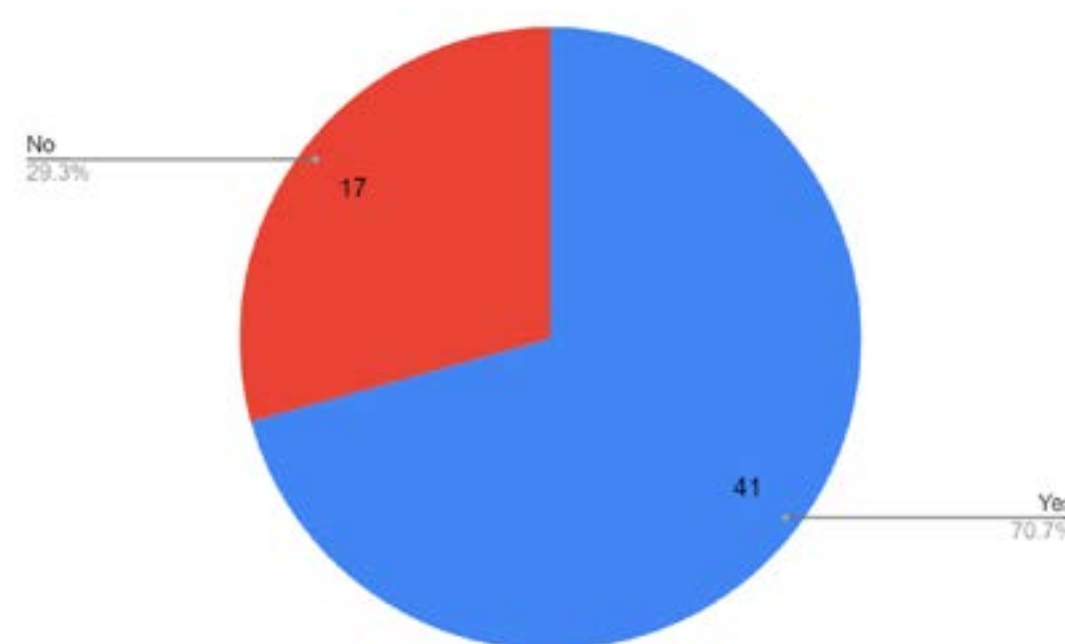

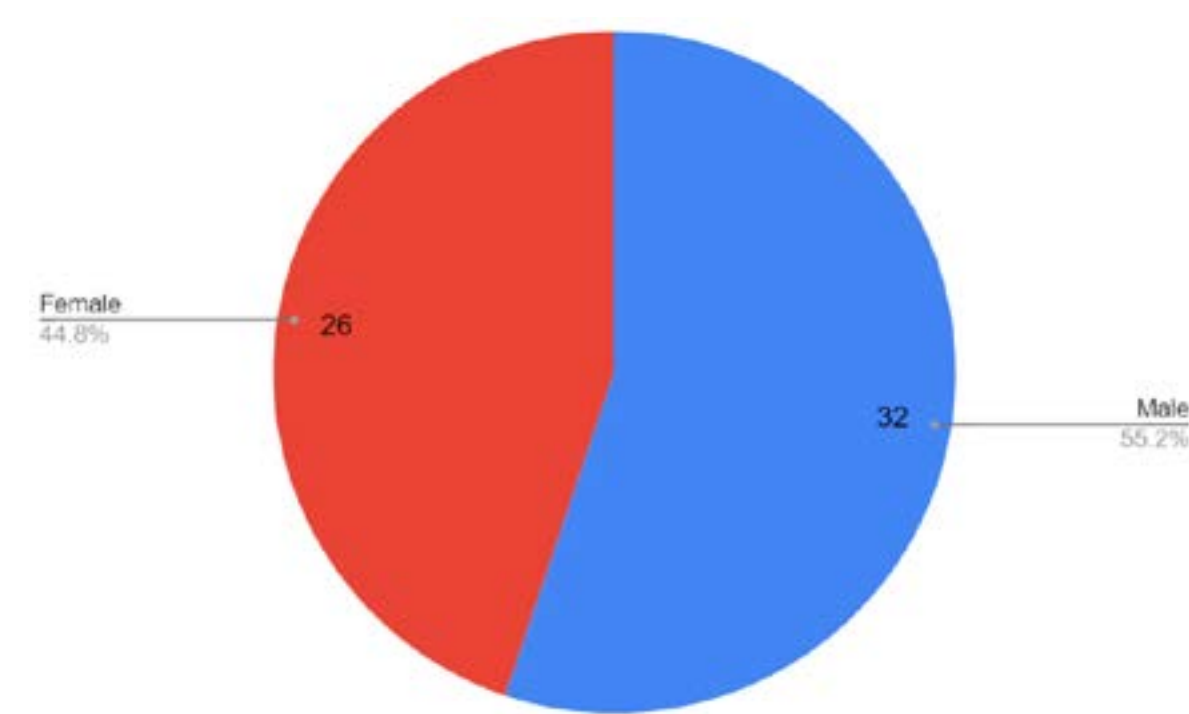
Which word best describes your local Masjid or Islamic Center?

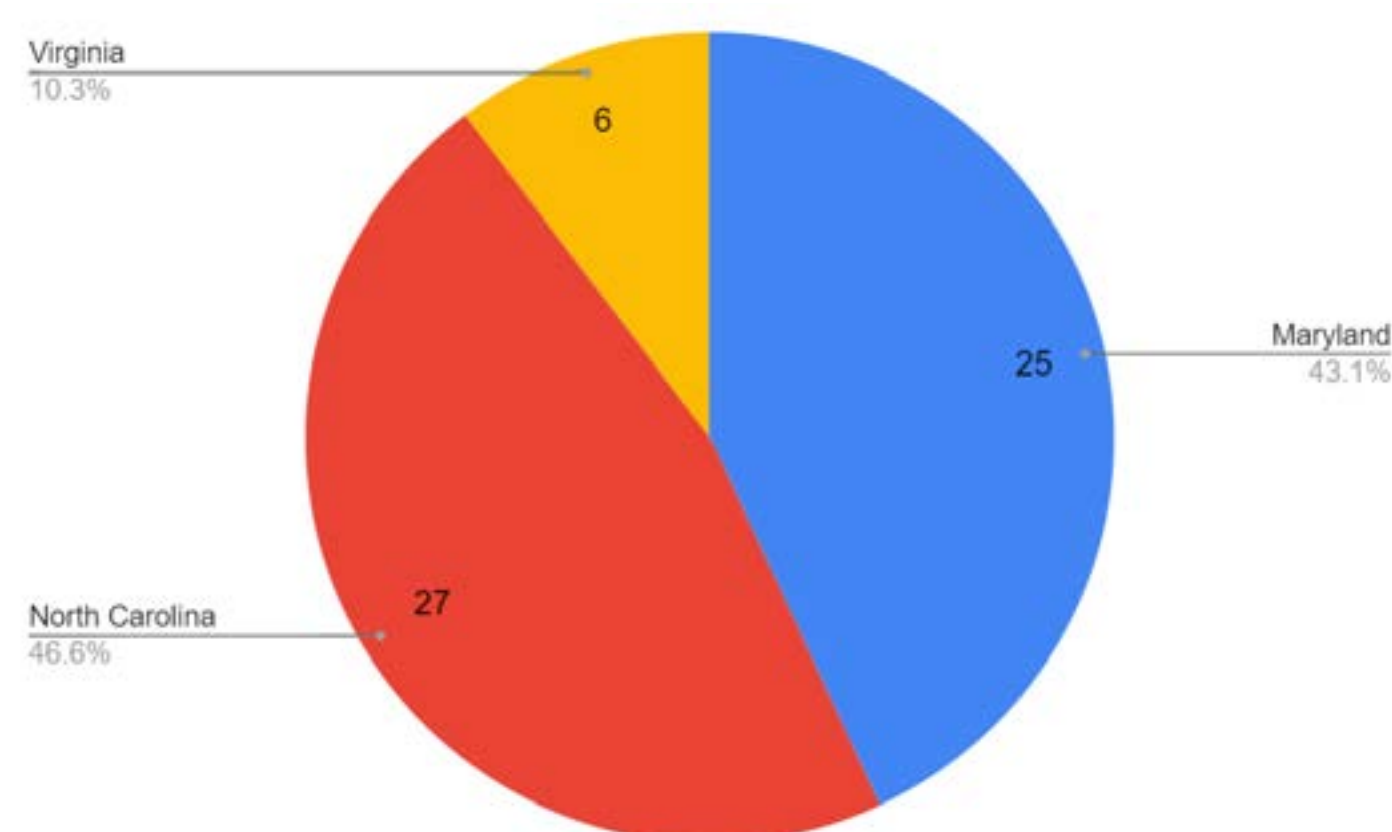

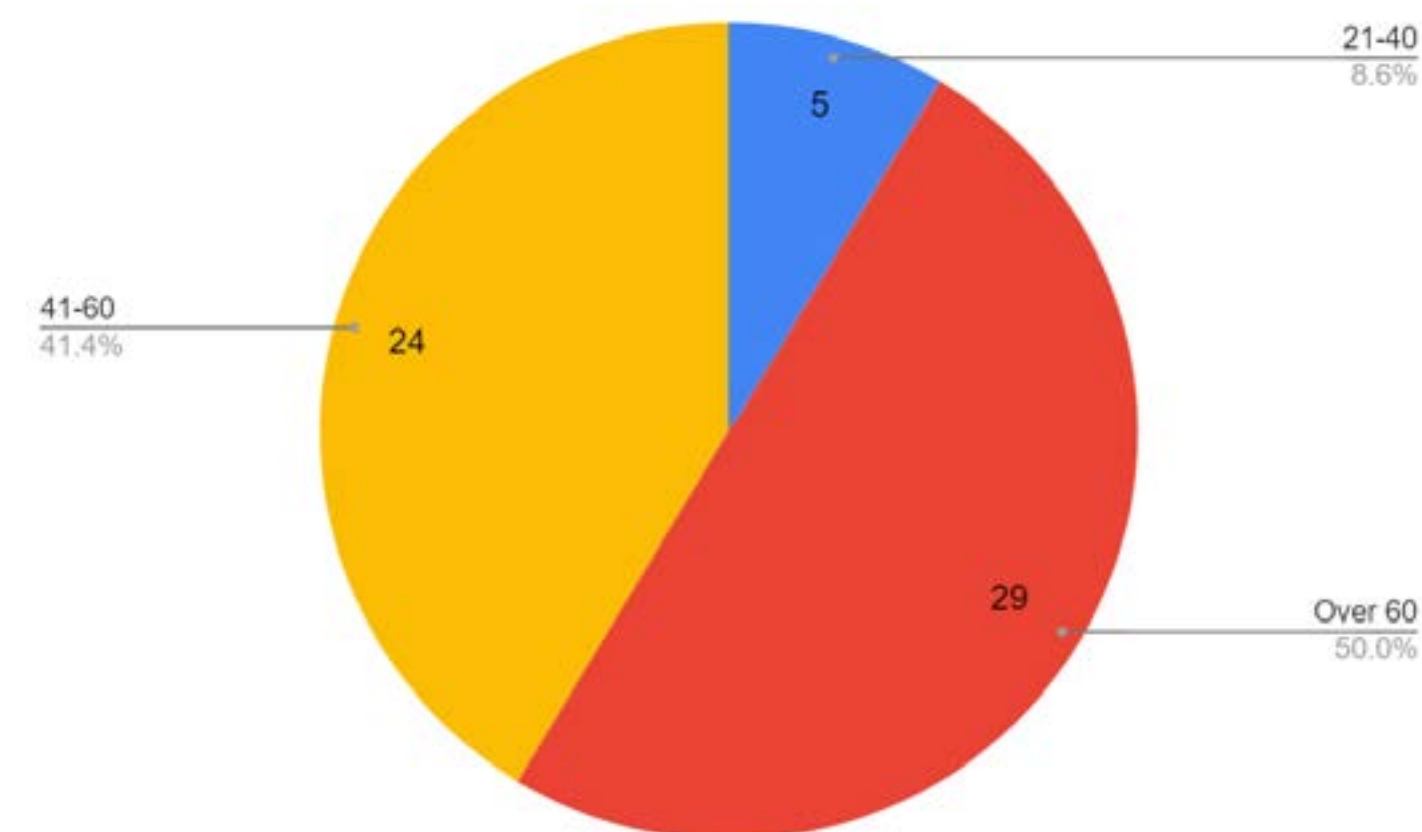
