

Statement Concerning the Recent **Events Impacting Muslims in America** and Throughout the World

Terrorism

The Conveners of Imams associated with the Community of Imam W. **Deen Mohammed** continue to stand in solidarity with those who are appalled and condemn the brutal murder and violence against innocent men, women, and children! We further condemn the un-Islamic extremism of individuals and groups, including ISIS, Al-Qaeda, Boko Haram, etc., perpetrated in the name of Al-Islam and Prophet Muhammad (pbuh). This includes the invitation to Muslims to join their inhuman and un-Islamic terror campaigns that murder and commit acts of violence against innocent people.

The religion of Al-Islam and the example of Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) promote human excellence, religious freedom, social justice, and tolerance of human and religious diversity. The recent horrific examples of crimes against humanity by those individuals claiming the banner of Al-Islam and/or affiliated with these groups are totally contrary to these universal principles which are embraced in the religion of Al-Islam.
