Summary Report

The Section Conveners held their third Community Leadership Summit (CLS) the weekend of June 6-7, 2014 in Cleveland Ohio. The CLS is an effort to provide a forum for Section Conveners, leaders of national organizations, and individuals with national influence in the community of Imam W. Midwest Leadership Team Reports
